James A. Jones, MS, is a St. Clair County Community College instructor of Criminal Justice and the advisor for the College Criminal Justice Club. He presents frequently on the topics of sexual assault and substance abuse. Jim holds a Master of Science Degree in Criminal Justice from Wayne State University. Jim served with the Port Huron Police Department for 28 years working through the ranks to Captain before his retirement in 2010. During his tenure with the department, Jim began the first special victims unit which specialized in sexual assault crimes. Jim's dedication to victim advocacy is recognized throughout the state and his contributions to improving the lives of its citizens well-known.



Mona S. Armstrong, JD, is a Senior Assistant Prosecuting Attorney in St. Clair County. She has sixteen years experience in the prosecution of domestic violence related offenses including sexual assault and homicide. Mona has conducted numerous training sessions for law enforcement, prosecutors, and service providers in the areas of domestic violence and sexual assault.



Stephen M. Thompson, MS, is one of the country's foremost experts on sexual assault, stalking, bullying and threat assessment. His unique approach is a result of over 30 years of research and street experience involving thousands of interviews with survivors and offenders. He presents programs dealing with bystander intervention, sexual assault, stalking, relationship violence,

threat assessment and workplace violence throughout the country. Thompson is an assault investigation consultant, criminal profiler and court qualified expert witness for agencies across the country. Thompson was credited with researching and labeling date rapists the "Nice Guy" when he published the behavioral analysis of familiar sexual predators titled: "Date/ Acquaintance Rape - The Crime and Criminal Profile" Campus Law Enforcement Journal, May 1995. He is an associate professor and the Sexual Aggression Services Director at Central Michigan University.
